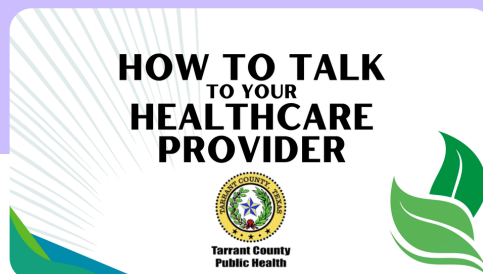
Thursday, January 8

Discover things to consider before, during, and after your medical visit. For adults only. First come, first served. This class is presented by the Tarrant County Public Health Department.



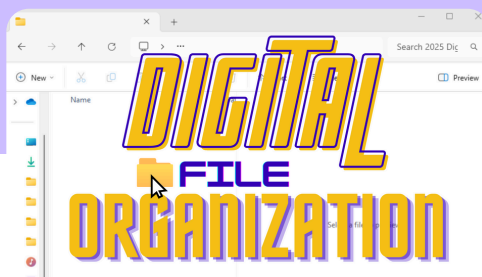
Thursday, January 22

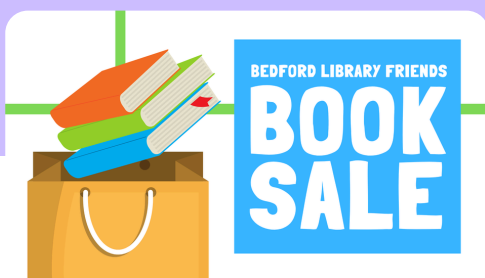
