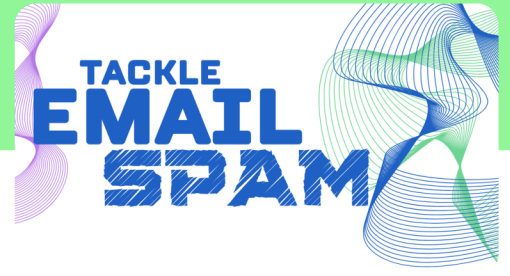
**Thursday, April 16

Help make fidget mats for local community members who have dementia or Alzheimer's. The group needs people who can sew; source materials; and deliver to patients and organizations.



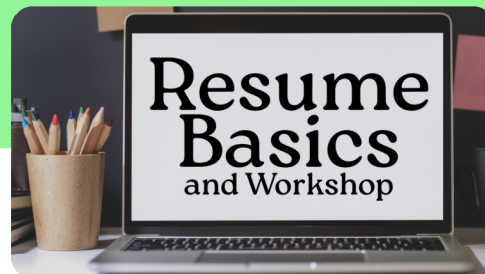
**Wednesday, April 22
